D MINOR JAZZ LEFT HAND STRIDE 1

Another way to play chords in the left hand is to use a technique called STRIDE This is where you play a bass note THEN the chord higher up the keyboard Try it with your D MINOR JAZZ chords

ALL LEFT HAND Hit a low **D** note Then an Dm7 chord Then an Em7 chord Hit a low **G** note Then an Gm7 chord Then an Am7 chord

Now try the progression and rhythm on the next page


D MINOR JAZZ LEFT HAND STRIDE 2

Listen carefully to the recording.

Play it nice and slow to give yourself plenty of time to improvise in the right hand.

Notice that even though the Em7 looks like it is played twice, it is actually played ONCE just before the end of the bar and HELD down throughout the next bar (That's what the little curved lines mean - they are called 'ties')
